The American Jewish World is very pleased to present artwork and a poem by Marcia Falk on the cover of our Rosh Hashana special edition.

The cover motif is based on Falk's illustration titled "Gilead Apples," which adorns the cover of her new book, *The Days Between: Blessings, Poems, and Directions for the Jewish High Holiday Season* (Brandeis).


The short poem on the cover, "Open the Heart," is an epigraph to her new book, which is a fascinating supplement to the traditional High Holidays liturgy. Rabbi David Teutsch, professor of Jewish civilization at the Reconstructionist Rabbinical College, calls it "a wonderful companion for the Ten Days of T'shuvah."

Falk, who lives in Berkeley, Calif.,

is a Brandeis University graduate, and went on to Stanford, where she earned a doctorate in English and comparative literature. She studied Hebrew language and literature at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem.

A professor of literature, Jewish studies, and creative writing for many years, Falk is a popular public speaker, on subjects ranging from Jewish women's voices to the love poetry of the Bible.

I first became aware of Falk's liturgical poetry when Harper Collins published her innovative and lovely prayer book, *The Book of Blessings: New Jewish Prayers for Daily Life, the Sabbath, and the New Moon Festival*, in 1996. (For our family Kabbalat Shabbat ritual over many years, we use her poem, "Bless-

ing the Children"; we place a hand on each son's head, say his name and recite: "Be who you are, and may you be blessed in all that you are.")

Israeli polygamist, cult leader convicted of sexual offenses

(JTA) — An Israeli polygamist and cult leader was convicted of several sexual offenses, including raping his wives.

Goel Ratzon, 64, was convicted Monday in Tel Aviv District Court on charges including rape, sodomy, indecent assault and sexual abuse within the family. He was cleared on one charge of sexually enslaving one of the women that he called his wife.

Ratzon was arrested and indicted four and a half years ago following a complaint filed by one of his of 21 "wives," with whom he fathered 38 children.

He made the women believe that he was the savior of the world and had supernatural abilities. Ratzon also alienated the women from their families and only allowed them to speak in public areas of their home.

Ratzon never officially married any of the women that he called his wives.
